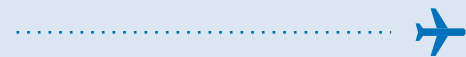
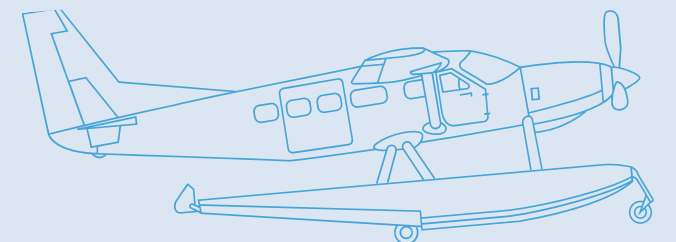

Welcome to the Grand Hall

The following events health and safety procedures must be read to the audience by either the MC or host, before an event commences.

Changes WIP

- Renewals and amendments
 - Messaging to consider splitting these activities out
 - Renewals have hard deadlines
 - Amendments are often more flexible
 - Bundling causes unnecessary time pressures for CAA staff and applicant
- Prioritisation of activities
 - 1st – Renewals – Cannot continue to operate without it, hard deadline
 - 2nd – Amendments – Supporting continued safe operations of certificated entities
 - 3rd – Initial Issues – Approval only when ready
- Timeliness measures for certification (refer SoPE)
 - Timeliness will not be at the detriment of safety (quality of decision-making is of primary importance)
 - Measures may assist in analysing resources, changes in processes, etc.
 - “If we don’t measure it, we can’t change it.”

Changes coming soon...

- Re-issue of delegations under the Civil Aviation Act of 2023
 - Changes to the Act references requires re-issue of delegations
- Improvements to Processes, Practices, Systems
 - Transition off ASMS (no longer supported) to Kapua business system, to enable future enhancements – WRs will be replaced by Kapua Job IDs.
 - New invoicing system on TechOne platform.
 - Changes to work assignment, tracking practices and tools.
- ICAO Safety Audit in July 2025
 - Preparations kicking off
