

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: Triple Star Management Ltd Crane at New Building T20 Remarkables Park

<u>PURSUANT TO</u> Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Murray John Porter, Acting Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Triple Star Management Ltd, notification of intention to erect a tower crane at the T20 Remarkables Park site in Queenstown, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

- The crane is to be of a conspicuous colour to allow pilots to sight it in time to take action to avoid it;
- The crane is to marked and lit in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part 77, Appendix B;
- Obstruction lighting is to be operated at all times of the day and night
- Queenstown Airport Corporation is to be provided with at least 5 days notice prior to the erection of the crane; and
- Queenstown Airport Corporation and the Civil Aviation Authority are to be advised when the crane operation ceases.

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on 9th day of April 2015 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.

The provisions of this determination are in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any other Act, or any orders or regulations made thereunder.
