



**NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: 2 Riccarton Avenue,
Christchurch.**

PURSUANT TO Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Manager Aeronautical Services, having received from Canterbury District Health Board, notification of intention to operate a crane at 2 Riccarton Avenue, Christchurch, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, would not constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE, I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF NO HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

1. The crane at the site must be equipped with a medium intensity flashing red light located at the highest available point, in accordance with CAR Part 77, Appendix B. The light(s) must be operational at all times; and
2. The crane must be equipped with a lighting system on the boom of the crane such that a helicopter approaching or departing from the Hospital Heliport can visually discern the whole length and orientation of the boom; and
3. Canterbury District Health Board shall issue a NOTAM for both the Christchurch Hospital Heliport and Christchurch Hospital Hagley Heliport for the operation of the crane. The wording shall be as shown in the attached Aeronautical Study; and
4. Canterbury District Health Board shall advise the CAA and Aeropath (phil.bickerton@aeropath.aero) when the crane operating at the Riccarton Avenue site is no longer required.

This Determination of No Hazard shall become final on 18 Mar 21 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of No Hazard shall expire on 18 September 2022.
