

NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE DETERMINATION: 100 Prices Road, Wiri, Auckland.

PURSUANT TO Rule Part 77 of the Civil Aviation Rules I, Sean Turangarau Kere Rogers, Head of Aeronautical Services, having received from, Macrennie Commercial Construction Limited, notification of intention to erect a crane at 100 Prices Road, Wiri, Auckland, conducted an aeronautical study in consultation with such persons, representatives and organisations as I considered appropriate.

After completing the aeronautical study, I am satisfied that the proposed action, if executed, could constitute a hazard in navigable airspace.

THEREFORE, I HEREBY ISSUE a

DETERMINATION OF HAZARD IN NAVIGABLE AIRSPACE

in respect of the above notification.

The following conditions are specific to this Determination:

1. The crane is to be lit in accordance with Civil Aviation Rule Part 77, Appendix B; and
2. The crane can only operate to the full height of 35.5m AGL when permission is received from Auckland Airport. At all other times the crane is to be lowered to a maximum height of 20m AGL; and
3. Prior to any crane operation above 20m AGL, Macrennie Commercial Construction Limited is to contact Auckland Airport Apron Control on (09)2568990 to notify of the intended operation and request a Notice to Airmen (NOTAM) is issued for the duration; and
4. Macrennie Commercial Construction Limited is to advise CAA (Quote 2025-01952 to aeronautical.services@caa.govt.nz) when the crane is finally lowered and no longer in use; and
5. Macrennie Commercial Construction Limited is to ensure they advise Auckland Airport Apron Control when the crane is finally lowered and no longer in use so that any active NOTAM can be cancelled.

This Determination of Hazard shall become final on 16th January 2026 unless a petition for review is received by the Director prior to that date.

This Determination of Hazard shall not expire but may be revoked, in writing, by the Director.
