

Part 21 application for issue, reissue, or amendment of an airworthiness certificate – standard or restricted category

- To avoid the issue of an airworthiness certificate being delayed, provide all information accurately and fully prior to the aircraft inspection date.
- Provisional information can be provided for some details (as indicated within each section), on the condition that all information is provided at or prior to the aircraft inspection date.
- Applications for aircraft without acceptable evidence of conformity should be submitted to the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) as soon as the aircraft arrives in New Zealand (NZ), or as soon as the decision to rebuild/restore/return aircraft to service is made.
- Full model and component designations are required (refer to the manufacturer's data plates).
- English translations of foreign documentation is to be provided. Please note, certified copies may be required.

Charges, fees and invoicing:

- Charges associated with an application will be invoiced to the person/organisation indicated under section '2. Invoice details'.

Submitting your application:

B. Eligibility investigation – information required:

Where an export airworthiness certificate (or equivalent document) is not available, or the aircraft was not last certified in NZ, CAA will conduct an eligibility investigation. This investigation determines and documents how the aircraft meets, or will meet, conformity requirements (see [Advisory Circular AC 21-2](#) for full details).

To support this process, relevant information should be supplied. This may include:

- a copy of the last valid airworthiness certificate
- summary of the available aircraft maintenance records
- a certified history of the aircraft since it was last airworthy.

Additional information is required if the aircraft was imported damaged or incomplete, or is being rebuilt after an accident in NZ. In these cases, additional information must be provided:

- photographs of the aircraft as imported
- a complete list of damage or missing components
- a copy of any accident report
- a summary of the proposed rebuild process including
 - source of replacement parts
 - approved repair schemes (where applicable)
 - approximate rebuild timetable.
