#### **CAUTION**

It is an offence to knowingly provide false information to the Civil Aviation Authority or Director of Civil Aviation relevant to the Authority's or the Director's exercise of powers under the Civil Aviation Act, or regulations or rules made under the Act. It is also an offence to fail to disclose, without reasonable excuse, information that is materially relevant in relation to a security check. Each offence is punishable by a term of imprisonment not exceeding 12 months or a fine not exceeding \$10,000. Section 49(1)(a) and Section 56A, Civil Aviation Act 1990.

#### **DO I HAVE TO AGREE TO A SECURITY CHECK?**

You must consent to the Aviation Security Service carrying out a security (background) check on you to determine whether you pose a threat to aviation security. If you refuse to consent to a security check, your application for an airport identity card will not be considered.

In carrying out a security check, we ask people or organisations to disclose information about you. For example we can seek: a recommendation from the New Zealand Security Intelligence Service, information about your criminal record (if any) from the Ministry of Justice, or information from the New Zealand Customs Service or the New Zealand Immigration Service.

You and your employer will be informed whether you have received a favourable security check determination or an adverse security check determination. Advice to your employer will not include the reason for, or details of, any determination.

#### Favourable security check determination

You need to receive a favourable security check determination in order to be granted a permanent airport identity card.

### Adverse security check determination

In the case of an adverse security check determination, you have the right to have the determination reviewed under section 77G of the Civil Aviation Act 1990. However, if your objection is based solely on a recommendation from the New Zealand Security Intelligence Service, you must follow a complaint process with the Inspector-General of Intelligence and Security under the Intelligence and Security Act 2017.

If new information comes to light at any time, we can reconsider a favourable security check determination and revoke your airport identity card. In this case, you should refer to section 77F of the Civil Aviation Act 1990.

#### WHAT HAPPENS TO MY PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Information contained in this application will be kept in the strictest confidence and handled according to the principles of the Privacy Act 2020. Under the Privacy Act you have the right to request access to, or correction of, any personal information held by the Aviation Security Service.
