ECG	 No history of cardiovascular disease & age under 65 and 5-year CV risk estimate < 10% 	→ Defer ECG to next application
	 History of stable cardiovascular disease and/or age over 65 	→ Defer ECG for no more than three months
	 5-year CV risk estimate >10% or history of cardiovascular disease that may have progressed or relapsed since last application 	→ Alternative method generally not acceptable. Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
Blood lipids	 No diagnosis of coronary or other significant cardiac disease 	→ Defer to next application & use last available results for cardiovascular risk estimation
	History of coronary artery disease	→ Alternative method generally not acceptable. Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
HBA1c	 No diagnosis of diabetes 	→ Defer testing to next application & use last available results for cardiovascular risk estimation
	 History indicates controlled and stable non-insulin treated diabetes 	→ Defer testing for no more than three months
	 Unstable non-insulin treated diabetes; or Insulin treated diabetes 	→ Alternative method generally not acceptable. Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
CV Risk Estimate	 If previous 5-year CV risk estimate < 10% based on last data 	→ Use most recent data for estimating 5-year risk
	 If previous or new 5-year CV risk estimate > 10% based on last data 	→ Alternative method generally not acceptable. Discuss with CAA Medical Unit

Special Eye report	 No eye disease or stable treated eye condition; and last GME and / or Special Eye report documented that vision met the CAA standards (corrected or uncorrected) 	→ Defer testing to next application
	 New visual symptoms or eye condition; or progressive / unstable eye condition 	ightarrow Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
Audiometry	Previously normal audiogram	ightarrow Defer testing to next application
	 Stable hearing loss within CAA standards 	ightarrow Defer testing to next application
	 History of stable hearing loss (aided or unaided) last meeting the medical manual guideline 	ightarrow Defer testing to next application
	 New onset of hearing loss; or hearing loss not meeting the medical manual guideline 	ightarrow Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
Spirometry	No respiratory disease but history of smoking	→ Defer testing to next application
	 Stable respiratory disease on history and previously acceptable spirometry 	ightarrow Defer testing to next application
	 New onset respiratory disease; or unstable respiratory disease (i.e.) interim acute respiratory episode (i.e. acute asthma); or previous borderline spirometry 	→ Discuss with CAA Medical Unit
Other reports, Specialist reports	Cancer, rheumatological conditions, mental health etc.	→ Defer for no more than three months, if stable on history.
