

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

## Power banks and spare lithium batteries must travel in your **carry-on bag**

**Never** in your checked luggage

Lithium batteries power many everyday items. These batteries can overheat and catch fire. If a fire happens in the cabin, crew can deal with it quickly and safely – **that's why they must be in your carry-on bag.**

**Pack smart and play your part.**

**All batteries must be packed in your carry-on bag:**



Spare lithium batteries\*  
(with terminals protected)

\* It is strongly recommended to pack ALL spare batteries in carry-on, not in checked luggage.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

## Battery-powered hair straighteners and heated styling devices



**Not permitted in:**

- carry-on bag
- checked-in luggage

(unless made safe, see below)

### Travelling with these devices safely

**Battery-powered heated styling devices can only travel if made safe by ONE of the following:**

- battery removed, or
- heating element removed, or
- another component removed to isolate the battery.

If you remove the battery:

- it must go in your carry-on bag only, and
- battery terminals must be protected (tape, pouch, or individual bag).

**If the device cannot be made safe, it cannot travel.**

This restriction applies to: hair straighteners, curling/wave/crimping irons, heated brushes, beard straighteners.

**Devices must not be used during the flight.**

*Plug-in mains-powered devices are allowed.*
