Rule objective

The objective of amendment 2 to Part 93 is to update the list of aerodromes and runways in Appendix C that have a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit.

Extent of consultation

During the past four years a number of right-hand aerodrome traffic circuits have been consulted with industry and implemented through the exemption process. In addition, a review of Appendix C showed that a number of other changes were required to:

- Correct the information in Appendix C in accordance with the current information that is published in the New Zealand Aeronautical Information Publication (NZAIP) for the various aerodromes:
- Delete or amend references to aerodromes and runways that have been closed, altered, or affected by the change in magnetic variation.

The proposed amendments to Appendix C were referred to the relevant aerodrome operators for confirmation of the details for their aerodromes before the rule proposal was published for formal consultation.

A Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, NPRM 03-05, containing the proposed update of Appendix C to Part 93 was issued for public consultation under Docket 3/CAR/2 on 26 June 2003.

The publication of this NPRM was notified in the Gazette on 26 June 2003 and advertised in the daily newspapers in the five main provincial centres on 28 June 2003. The NPRM was published on the CAA web site and sent to all those aerodrome operators that are affected by the changes except those where the aerodrome has actually closed.

A period of 28 days was allowed for comment on the proposed rule.

Summary of comments

Eight written submissions were received on the NPRM.

One submission advised of a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit that is in the NZAIP but missing from the update for Appendix C.

Two submitters confirmed that the details listed in Appendix C for their aerodromes are correct.

One submission advised of a recently established runway with a righthand aerodrome traffic circuit that was not included in the update for Appendix C.

One late submission advised of a request from an aircraft operator to include a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit for a runway that was not currently listed in Appendix C, but was being processed for inclusion in the NZAIP.

One submission advised of a changed runway designation for a runway.

One late submission advised of changed runway designations as a result of recent aerodrome developments.

One submission referred to other aspects of Part 93 that are not part of this rule amendment.

These submissions and comments were considered and as a result three additional runways with right-hand aerodrome traffic circuits were added to Appendix C, and the runway designation for three runways were amended

The rule as amended was then referred to Parliament's Regulations Review Committee before being signed by the Associate Minister of Transport.

Examination of comments

Comments may be examined by application to the Docket Clerk at the Civil Aviation Authority between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on weekdays, except statutory holidays.

Insertion of Amendments

The amendments to the rules in this Part are reflected by the revocation of the existing table in Appendix C and replacement with a new table.

Effective date of rule

Amendment 2 to Part 93 comes into force on 9 January 2004.

Consultation Details

(This statement does not form part of the rules contained in Part 93. It provides details of the consultation undertaken in making the rules.)

Notice of Proposed Rule Making

An NPRM was published under Notice of Proposed Rule Making 03-05 (Docket Number 3/CAR/2) on 26 June 2003. This notice proposed amendments to Appendix C of Part 93–Aerodrome Traffic Rules and Noise Abatement Procedures. Eight written submissions were received on the NPRM.

Summary of Comments on NPRM Docket Number 3/CAR/2 General comments on the NPRM

The aerodrome operators at Franz Josef and Dannevirke aerodromes advised that the details in Appendix C for their aerodromes are correct.

Palmerston North International Airport commented that a proposed noise abatement procedure for the airport had been developed as part of the initial work on the main Part 93 rules project in 1999, but there has been no further action since. They requested the status of this project.

CAA Comment: The main Part 93 rules project is a separate project that is not included in the current 2003/04 Rules Programme.

Specific comments on the NPRM

The RNZAF advised that a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit is required for grass runway 27 at Ohakea to avoid conflict with aircraft using the main runway.

CAA Comment: The right-hand circuit for grass runway 27 at Ohakea has been included in Appendix C

A CAA Field Safety Adviser advised that Foxpine aerodrome has a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit for runway 27 and is listed in the NZAIP but had not been included in the proposed update of Appendix C.

CAA Comment: The runway 27 right-hand circuit for Foxpine aerodrome has been included in Appendix C.

Astral Limited submitted that due to a change in magnetic variation, the runway designation for runway 19 at Rotorua aerodrome (which has a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit) needs to change to 18.

CAA Comment: The change of runway designation has been included in Appendix C.

Airways Corporation advised that Heliventures Ltd have requested that Haast aerodrome be published in the NZAIP with a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit for runway 16.

CAA Comment: CAA Aeronautical Services Unit has agreed to a right-hand aerodrome traffic circuit for runway 16 and this runway has been included in Appendix C.

Tauranga Airport Authority advised that as a part of recent aerodrome developments, grass runways 03 and 21 have been realigned and the runway designations are now grass runway 04 and grass runway 22 respectively.

CAA Comment: The changes in runway designations have been included in Appendix C.
