Exemption from the Requirement in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 125.557(d)(1)

PURSUANT TO Section 37(2)(c) of the Civil Aviation Act 1990,

- I, Stephen Hunt, General Manager Air Transport & Airworthiness, being satisfied that—
 - (a) The requirement for a pilot to hold an instrument rating before commencing introduction training with an operator conducting operations under Part 125 is unreasonable when the pilot will be flying only under Visual Flight Rules; and
 - (b) the risk to safety will not be significantly increased by the granting of this exemption,

HEREBY EXEMPT—

Pilots commencing the introduction segment of a training programme required by rule 125.553 who are employed by the holder of an air operator certificate to carry out VFR operations only

FROM-

the requirement in Civil Aviation Rule CAR 125.557(d)(1) that a pilot may not commence an introduction segment of the training programme under paragraph (a) unless the pilot holds a current instrument rating,

PROVIDED THAT—

When the training is completed, the pilot will be operating only under Visual Flight Rules.

This exemption shall remain in effect unless withdrawn in writing by the Director.
